**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE REVISED CHILDREN'S WELFARE CODE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO**

**WHEREAS**, Article XV, Section 312 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that "the State shall defend the right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition, and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation, and other conditions prejudicial to their development";

**WHEREAS**, Section 447, Paragraph (5), Article 3, Chapter 3, Title 2, Book III of RA 7160, provided that the Sangguniang Bayan has the powers and duties to approve ordinances which shall ensure the efficient and effective delivery of basic services and facilities, and further provide for the care of paupers, the aged, the sick, persons of unsound mind, abandoned minors, abused children, disabled persons, Juvenile delinquents, drugs dependents, and other needed and disadvantaged persons, particularly children and youth below eighteen (18) years of age;

**WHEREAS**, Section 2(a) of RA 9344 provides that the state recognizes the vital role of children and youth in nation building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral spiritual, intellectual and social well-being;

**WHEREAS**, under Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that local government units shall exercise it powers to promote the general welfare of its people;

**WHEREAS**, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan enacted Provincial Ordinance No. 84-2018 entitled "AN ORDINANCE ENACTING THE REVISED CHILDREN'S CODE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO last August 13, 2018;

**WHEREAS**, in pursuit of the constitutional mandate, the Committee of the Whole of the Sangguniang Bayan of Gloria found the adoption of Provincial Ordinance No. 84-2018 entitled "AN ORDINANCE ENACTING THE REVISED CHILDREN'S CODE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO relevant, logical and appropriate to the youth of todays and future generation;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** as it is hereby ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of Gloria, Oriental Mindoro that:

**Section 1. Title.** This Ordinance shall be known as "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE REVISED CHILDREN'S WELFARE CODE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO"

**Section 2. Basic Principles and Policies.** The implementation of the Code shall be guided with entire provisions contained in the "Revised Children's Welfare Code of Oriental Mindoro.


**Section 3. Funding.** To ensure the effective and efficient implementation of this Ordinance, the Local Government Unit of Gloria shall allocate initial fund amounting One Million Pesos (P1,000,000.00) and shall regularly appropriate funds.

**Section 4. Separability Clause.** If for any reason a provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, all other provisions herein not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**Section 5. Repealing Clause.** All ordinances, executive orders, resolutions and other local memoranda or rules inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**Section 6. Effectivity Clause.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and after posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places in the territorial jurisdiction of this Local Government Unit such as but not limited to Barangay Hall, Public Market, Central Terminal and Municipal Hall and publication in a local newspaper for a period of two (2) consecutive weeks.





#### AN ORDINANCE ENACTING THE REVISED CHILDREN'S WELFARE CODE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO

**WHEREAS**, Article XV, Section 3(2) of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that "the State shall defend the right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition, and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation, and other conditions prejudicial to their development";

**WHEREAS**, under Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that local government units shall exercise its powers to promote the general welfare of its people;

**WHEREAS**, on 22 September 2003, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Oriental Mindoro enacted Provincial Ordinance No. 008-2003, otherwise known as the "Child Welfare Code of Oriental Mindoro";

**WHEREAS**, some of the provisions of the said ordinance have been amended by virtue of subsequent ordinances;

**WHEREAS**, a thorough review of the provisions of Provincial Ordinance No. 008-2003 was conducted to ensure that such policy corresponds to the prevailing issues related to children's welfare and compatible with the existing laws, rules and regulations;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, as it is hereby ordained by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Oriental Mindoro that:

**ARTICLE I  
TITLE, POLICIES, PRINCIPLES AND DEFINITION OF TERMS**

**Section 1. Title.** This Ordinance shall be known as the "Ordinance Providing for Children's Survival, Development, Protection and Participation, and Establishing a Comprehensive Children and Family Support System in Oriental Mindoro", otherwise known as the "Revised Children's Welfare Code of Oriental Mindoro".

**Section 2. Declaration of Principles and Policies.**

It shall be the policy of the Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro to protect and rehabilitate children threatened or endangered by circumstances that affect their survival and normal development. Therefore, it is necessary that measures shall be imposed to safeguard the rights and well-being of the younger generation to make them effective and productive citizens of the nation.


Oriental Mindoro is hereby declared as a child-friendly province. Perforce, it shall uphold the survival, development, protection and participation rights of the child ensuring that all programs geared toward the achievement and protection of the above rights are given priority.

In pursuit of the above, the Provincial Government shall strengthen the establishment of a comprehensive support system that shall sustain the effective delivery of comprehensive services to children and their families. Furthermore, it acknowledges the protective responsibility and primary care of the family by supporting and promoting the efforts of the parents, child care and development workers, as well as the active contributions of the public, private, academic and religious sectors in the care of children from infancy to adolescence. It also recognizes the role of mass media in informing and educating the general public in matters and issues that concern the children.

**Section 3. Definition of Terms.** For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms are hereby defined and shall be construed as follows:

- a. Children - shall refer to persons below 18 years of age and shall include those over 18 years old but are unable to fully protect and take care of themselves from abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation or discrimination because of physical or mental disability or condition.
- b. Children With Disability - means a child evaluated as having mental retardation, a hearing impairment, a speech or language impairment, a visual impairment, a serious emotional disturbance, an orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, and other health impairment, a specific learning disability, deaf-blindness, or multiple disabilities, and who, by reason thereof, needs special education and related services.
- c. Survival Rights - shall refer to the rights of children to life, health and nutrition, adequate living standard, parental care and support and social security. Such rights shall be enjoyed by the children starting from conception.
- d. Development Rights - shall include, but are not limited to, the rights of children to education, the right to information, the right to recreation, play, leisure and cultural activities, freedom of religion, and the right of a child with disability to special care.



- e. Protection Rights - refer to those that will provide safeguards for children against all forms of abuses, such as child labor, sexual exploitation, sale and trafficking, torture, deprivation of liberty and armed conflict, drug abuse and neglect. Protection rights also include the right to be safe in emergency or especially difficult circumstances, the right to live in a peaceful and wholesome environment and the right to legal assistance and appropriate judicial process.
- f. Participation Rights - cover the children's rights to opinion, freedom of expression, freedom of thought, conscience and religion and freedom of association.
- g. Life-Cycle Approach - shall refer to the holistic view of the child's rights throughout the life-cycle of the child, which includes five stages as follows:
  - i. Pre-Natal Stage - pertains to the period of gestation of the unborn child where the mother's nourishment, health and safety directly affect the fetus. This also concerns the rights of the child to be born healthy, well and wanted.
  - ii. Infancy Stage - shall include, but are not limited to, the right of a newly born child to name nationality and identity, and such other rights, at this stage (newborn up to 2 years of age) that are vital for the survival and development of child.
  - iii. Early Childhood Stage - shall include, but are not limited to, the right of the child to parental care and support at this stage (3-5 years), to explore the home and its environment, and to develop interpersonal and socialization skills.
  - iv. Childhood Stage - shall include, but not limited to, the right of a child to experience childhood care and stimulation for development at this stage (6-12 years).
  - v. Adolescent Stage - shall include, but not limited to, the right to total development of the child's potentials at this stage (13-17 years), whether physical, moral, spiritual and intellectual development.
- h. Circumstances which threaten or endanger the survival and normal development of children shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - i. To live with a family of drug users or drug dealers or to be with family members or guardians having psychological problems grave enough for them to commit incest, siblings rape, lascivious acts and other forms of physical and mental abuse;
  - ii. To live a life style of mendicants and vagrants;
  - iii. To live or find themselves in the streets of rural or urban areas without the care of parents or guardians or any adult supervision needed for their welfare;
  - iv. To be a member of community, especially Mangyan children, living under conditions of extreme poverty and in underdeveloped areas with inadequate access to basic services needed for a good quality of life;
  - v. To be in a community where there is an armed conflict or affected by armed conflict-related activities and where peril to life and limb is imminent;
  - vi. To work under the conditions hazardous to life, safety and morals which duly interfere with their normal development;
  - vii. To be a victim of child prostitution and child trafficking;

- viii. To be a victim of man-made or natural disasters or calamities; and
- ix. To be in such conditions or circumstances analogous to those above-stated which endanger the life, safety or normal development of children.
- i. Anti-Social Related Activities - shall refer to those acts against property, chastity of person which include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - i. Rape and incest;
  - ii. Pimping for prostitutes;
  - iii. Participating in obscene or lewd shows;
  - iv. Selling illegal or lewd reading materials;
  - v. Selling or purchasing cigarette or cigar products to or for minors;
  - vi. Using and pushing prohibited drugs;
  - vii. Petty crimes, such as snatching and shoplifting;
  - viii. Gambling in all forms;
  - ix. Unjust and inhumane manner of eviction and demolition;
  - x. Bullying; and
  - xi. Any other circumstances analogous to those already mentioned as provided for in other existing laws.
- j. Primary Health Care Program - covers the totality of all comprehensive programs and intervention measures to realize the goals of child survival throughout the child's pre-natal up to the early childhood stage, including the goals of safe motherhood within the framework of accessible primary health services and efficient preventive care.
- k. Early Childhood Care and Development Program - refers to the over-all development programs and support initiatives of the Provincial Government that will safeguard the survival and development rights of children of Oriental Mindoro ranging from three to five years old.
- l. Family/Community Welfare and Development Program - refers to the comprehensive family development programs and various community support systems consistent with the Provincial Government's commitment to develop the physical, moral, spiritual well-being both in the affective and cognitive level of child.
- m. Community Support System - refers specifically to the community support structures that will safeguard the survival, development, protection and participation rights of children.
- n. Teenage Kiosks/Centers - serve as an information hub and counseling nook for adolescents and can be set up in school and community.

**ARTICLE II**  
**SURVIVAL AND DEVELOPMENT RIGHTS OF CHILDREN**

**Section 4. Role of the Provincial Government.** The Provincial Government shall ensure the survival, development, participation and protection of the children of Oriental Mindoro under the following programs:

a. The Primary Health Care Program - The Provincial Government shall sustain the Primary Health Care Program to cater primarily to the children of Oriental Mindoro. To further ensure the implementation of this section, it shall take appropriate measures to support the program on health and preventive care as follows:

i. Maternal and Child Health Care Program - The Provincial Government shall continue to implement its maternal and childcare service program to ensure the safety and health of the mother and the provision of essential health care services all throughout the life-cycle of a child from pre-natal, infancy, early childhood up to adolescence stage. These include basic prenatal, postnatal delivery care to mothers, and promotion of health services to combat diarrhea, measles, pneumonia, neonatal tetanus, poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis and other endemic diseases. Also incorporated in this program is the expanded immunization of the targeted population with BCG, DPT, Polio, Measles, Hepatitis B, including tetanus toxoid to all pregnant mothers.

To attain this purpose, the Provincial Government shall enforce the provisions of Executive Order No. 51, otherwise known as the "Milk Code of the Philippines", which prohibit the promotion and marketing of formula milk by health facilities and workers pursuant to the global public health recommendation of the World Health Organization (WHO) and International Food Safety Authorities Network (INFOSAN) that infants should be exclusively breastfed for the first six months of life to achieve optimal growth, development and health. Thereafter, to meet their evolving nutritional requirements, infants should receive nutritionally adequate and safe complementary foods while breastfeeding continues up to two (2) years of age and beyond.

Relatedly, the Provincial Government shall ensure availability of breastfeeding areas in all public and private establishments and shall initiate organization of breastfeeding support groups in the barangay level.

ii. Indigenous and Mother Health Program - The Provincial Government shall maintain the Mangyan Wing at the Oriental Mindoro Provincial Hospital (OMPH) and its satellite community hospitals in selected municipalities of the province to provide the basic health services and preventive care both for the indigenous mother and child. The Provincial Health Office shall include as one of its priority agenda a special health program for indigenous people. The Provincial Indigenous Peoples Development and Advisory Council (PIPDAC) is mandated to formulate the over-all plan, programs and policies on issues, problems and concerns affecting the Mangyan and self-reliant sector of the province, while preserving their unique culture and tradition.

Further, the Provincial Health Office (PHO) shall strive to provide proper segregation of children and adults in the Mangyan Wing of the OMPH.

Privacy during child delivery of Mangyan mothers in their respective "Mangyan Paanakan Centers" shall be strictly observed.

iii. Population Management, Family Planning and Responsible Parenthood Program- The Provincial Government shall continue to support the goal of responsible parenthood, family planning and sustainable development which seeks to manage the balance of population, resources and environment towards the attainment of an improved quality of life.

iv. Integrated Management of Childhood Illness Program- the Provincial Government shall continue to implement the integrated management of childhood illnesses through the accurate identification of childhood illnesses by

ensuring appropriate combine treatment of illnesses, by strengthening the counseling of caretakers, and by speeding up the referral of severely ill children.

b. The Early Childhood Care and Development Programs - The Provincial Government shall support and sustain the Early Childhood Care and Development Programs, which shall include the following:

i. Day Care Service Enhancement Program - The Provincial Government shall sustain and improve the delivery of day care service to children with ages ranging from three to below five years old by providing augmentation support for Day Care Facilities, equipment's and program materials.

The role of Child Development Workers in the effective and efficient implementation of the Day Care Service program of the province is hereby recognized.

ii. Nutrition Program - The Nutrition Program of the PGOOrM shall include nutritional feeding, food and micronutrient supplementation, iodine and iron supplementation to address the Iodine Deficiency Disorder (IDD) and Vitamin A deficiency among pre-school children and malnutrition and Iron Deficiency Anemia (IDA) among pre-school children. To fully implement this program, the Provincial Government shall support iodized salt supplementation and promote the use of iodized salt province-wide, as mandated under the Republic Act No. 8172, otherwise known as "An Act for Salt Iodization Nationwide (ASIN Law)."

Furthermore, the Provincial Government shall establish enabling mechanism or nutrition education for mothers and vegetable production for indigent families. The supervision, monitoring and evaluation of nutritional feeding shall be the responsibility of the Provincial Nutrition Action Officer, in coordination with the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children.

iii. Child Minding Service Program - The Provincial Government shall establish and maintain a Child Minding Facility for the care of 0 to 3 years old children of working parents in the Provincial Government under the supervision of PSWDO. Such facility shall be manned by regular and competent personnel with plantilla positions, subject to CSC rules and regulations.

A monthly fee of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) per child shall be imposed to the parents availing the services.

The Provincial Government shall encourage its component LGUs to establish Child Minding Centers in their respective areas of jurisdiction.

c. Comprehensive Family and Community Welfare and Development Programs - The Provincial Government shall take appropriate measures to support and sustain the various programs for the family and community under a Family and Community Welfare Program, which shall include programs and services on reproductive health, child health and child-rearing practices, parent effectiveness, pre-marriage and marriage counseling, responsible parenthood, substance abuse prevention, child's right awareness, gender sensitivity, community organizing, child and youth education and participation, community volunteer resource development, crisis and disaster rehabilitation and management, among others.

The following programs shall form part of this Comprehensive Family and Community Welfare and Development Program of the Provincial Government:

i. Childhood Education Program - The Provincial Government shall zealously support the development of children ages 3-5 in their physical, social, moral, spiritual, emotional and cognitive development by providing continued support

to the DepEd Community-Based Pre-School classes. Likewise, the Provincial Government shall support and promote the development of children from six years old and above, in all levels of development to ensure a better future for the children of Oriental Mindoro.

- ii. Institutionalization of PPSKa - The Programang Pang-Edukasyon sa Kalibliban (PPSKa), designed to augment the need for teachers in all public and secondary schools is hereby institutionalized. As such, the Provincial Government shall maintain, sustain and continue to implement the deployment of PPSKa teachers and institutional facilitators in public elementary and secondary schools who will join the Department of Education (DepEd) workforce to handle structured classroom instruction, as the Provincial Government's response to the social problems of illiteracy, poverty and unemployment.

The Division of Oriental Mindoro and the Division of Calapan City of the DepEd are enjoined to measure PPSKa teacher's performance due to promotion, on the basis of academic achievement of their pupils/students rather than physical development of their schools.

- iii. Support to Secondary Ecological School (Paaralan ng Katutubo sa Kabundukan) and Special Opportunity Classes - The Provincial Government shall continue to support the Secondary Ecological School for the Mangyans and expand access to basic education for the Mangyan children by establishing Secondary Ecological Schools both in the province.
- iv. Special Education Program for Children With Disability - The PGOOrM, thru the Education & Employment Services Division-Governor's Office, shall provide educational assistance to children with disability in the province.


- v. Data Bank System for Children - The Provincial Government shall establish a Data Bank System where the data collected from a periodic comprehensive survey and situational analysis on the children is to be kept and filed. The data gathered therefrom, shall be the basis for planning of the PGOOrM and other agencies handling the programs and projects for the children.

- vi. Expanded Sports Development and Scholarship Program - The Provincial Government, thru the Special Concerns Division - Governor's Office, shall formulate, adopt and implement an integrated year-round plan of action on community-based sports development program for the youth in accordance with the policy of "Sports for All", in coordination with the other concerned agencies. The said plan of action shall form part of the comprehensive physical fitness and sports development of the province envisioned to develop and prepare potentially talented athletes and youth for participation to higher level of competitions, as well as to train a corps of local sports managers per municipality for the proper and orderly administration of sports activities in priority sports.


In furtherance of this provision, the Provincial Government shall endeavor to establish a sports clinic in the fourteen (14) municipalities and one (1) city of the province.


Educational assistance to indigents but deserving high school graduates shall be maintained and expanded by increasing the number of scholarship grantees from two to three slots per municipality and city and from one to two slots for Indigenous Peoples (IPs) each from the seven ethno-linguistic Mangyan tribes in the province. In case there is no qualified and deserving grantee from any minority tribe, the available slots shall be given to any qualified applicant, provided that he/she belongs to any of the tribe.


  
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
  
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

vii. Other Support Mechanism for Education - In order to ensure quality education, the Provincial School Board is mandated to provide allocation for books and other instructional material intended for the use of the said schools.

viii. Adolescent Health Program - The Provincial Government shall sustain and support the existing health-related activities for the youth by promoting the adolescents well-being through the formation, internalization and practice of proper values related to their reproductive and sexual health that will prepare them to make adult and responsible decisions as they mature and develop to be productive citizens of the country.

Corollary on the above provision, the PGOrM, in coordination with the DepEd, shall strive to establish Teenage Centers/Kiosks in all secondary public schools in the province.

ix. Barangay Health Program - The Provincial Government shall implement, provide and expand the coverage and delivery of essential health services to generally inaccessible areas through regular outreach and mobile clinic missions and encourage community participation in joint partnership with the barangay health workers of the province.

x. Health Care Program for Indigents - The Provincial Government shall sustain the Health Care Program for indigents by expanding the enrollment of their families under universal coverage to national health insurance program and providing a basic package of needed personal health services to indigents through premium subsidy and through proper implementation of the "Point of Care Enrollment Program" in the province.

xi. Livelihood and Food Security Program - The PGOrM, through the Provincial Agriculture Office (PAgO), shall ensure that the right to survival and food security of the children of Oriental Mindoro are safeguarded by promoting sustainable agriculture and food production at home, in schools and in the community.

xii. Women Welfare Program - The Provincial Government recognizes the role of the women in nation building and their effective participation in the rearing and caring of children. Hence, it shall establish and support Women Welfare and Development Program which shall include courses and services such as safe motherhood, responsible parenthood, child rearing practices, self-enhancement, formal and non-formal education, skills development, skill training for employment, livelihood support, maternal health and child care, pre-marital and marriage counseling, crisis and disaster management, gender sensitivity and parent effectiveness program, crisis intervention scheme for battered women, women rights awareness, among others.

xiii. Environment and Sanitation Program - The Provincial Government shall ensure compliance to the Sanitation Code of the Philippines by maintaining massive support to environmental and sanitation projects, which include construction of sanitary toilets in the target areas within the province, inspection of water sources, disinfection of contaminated water sources, sanitation and inspection of food establishments, provision of potable water supply, prevention/control of water-borne diseases, training of food handlers and operators of restaurants on sanitary practices and zero waste management.

xiv. Institutionalization of Adopt-A-School Program - The Provincial Government, in coordination with the Department of Education, shall support and ensure the implementation of R.A. No. 8526, otherwise known as "An Act Establishing the Adopt-a-School Program".

  
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

xv. Inclusion of the Rights of Children in the Curriculum - As part of the Provincial Government's advocacy, information and education campaign on the survival, development, protection, and participation rights of children, all private and public schools at all levels shall be enjoined to include the Convention on the Rights of Children as part of their school curriculum.

d. Comprehensive Community Support System - The Provincial Council for the Protection of Children (PCPC), together with the Municipal/City/ Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (M/C/BPC), shall serve as community support system that will safeguard the survival, development, protection, and participation rights of children.

**ARTICLE III  
PROTECTION RIGHTS OF CHILDREN**

**Section 5. Program on Children's Protection from All Forms of Neglect, Abuse, Cruelty, Exploitation and Discrimination.** There shall be a comprehensive program to

protect the children of Oriental Mindoro and to provide safeguards against all forms of abuse (physical abuse, neglect, child labor, sexual exploitation, child prostitution, child trafficking, torture and deprivation of liberty, drug abuse and armed conflict) and of obscene publications and indecent shows and such other acts of abuse or circumstances which endanger the child's survival and development. The PSWDO and the PCPC shall formulate the said program in coordination with other government agencies, and concerned NGO's within one (1) year from the date of effectivity of this ordinance.


**Section 6. Posting of Notices and Information on Child Protection at All Entry Points for Front Desk of Selected Establishments.** All hotels, lodging inns, motels, disco houses, videoke bars, night clubs, beach resorts and other establishments of similar services shall be required to post notices and information about child protection to forewarn potential child traffickers, pimps and child molesters. The notices and information to be posted at the entry points or front desks of said establishments shall be developed by the Provincial Government through the Communication and Public Relations Services Division - Governor's Office (CPRSD-GO).

To ensure compliance by the concerned establishments to this section, the Municipal License Division of the respective municipalities shall require these establishments to post such information or notices before their respective license shall be renewed and/or approved.


**Section 7. Prohibited Acts.** Pursuant to the provisions of R.A. No. 7610, the following acts are prohibited, to wit:

- a. Child Abuse. The following acts shall be considered as "Child Abuse":
  - i. Psychological and physical abuse, neglect, cruelty, sexual abuse and emotional maltreatment;
  - ii. Any act by deeds or words which debases, degrades or demeans the intrinsic worth and dignity of a child as a human being;
  - iii. Unreasonable deprivation of his basic needs for survival such as food and shelter; and
  - iv. Failure to immediately give medical treatment to an injured child resulting in serious impairment of his growth and development or in his permanent incapacity or death

b. Other Acts of Abuses. Any parent who commits any of the following acts shall be held liable for "Child Abuse," viz:

- i. Conceals or abandon the child with intent to make such child loose his/her civil status;
- ii. Abandons the child under such circumstance as to deprive him/her of the love, care and protection he/she needs;
- iii. Neglects the child by not giving him/her the education which the family's situation in life and financial conditions permit;
- iv. Causes, abates or permits the truancy of the child from the school where he is enrolled;
- v. Improperly exploits the child by using him/her, directly or indirectly, such as for purposes of begging and other acts which are inimical to the child's interest and welfare;
- vi. Permits the child to possess, handle or carry a deadly weapon, regardless of its ownership; and
- vii. Allows or requires the child to drive without a license or with license which the parent knows to have been illegally procured.

c. Exploitation. The hiring, employment, persuasion, inducement or coercion of a child to perform in obscene exhibition and indecent shows, whether live or in video or film, or to pose or act as a model in obscene publication or pornographic materials, or to sell or distribute said materials is absolutely prohibited.

d. Abuses during Armed Conflict. Children shall not be recruited as combatants or used as guides, couriers or spies and shall not be the subject of attacks.

Corollary thereof, the rights of the children taken into custody by the government forces in an armed conflict area shall be recognized. Moreover, the parents or guardian or the children in their custody shall be immediately notified of such fact.

e. Labor-Related Offenses Against Children. Children below fifteen (15) years of age shall not be employed.


However, children may be allowed to be employed when the child works directly under the sole responsibility of his/her parents or legal guardian and where only members of the employer's family are employed; provided, that children work for a maximum of 20 hours per week or 4 hours per day; provided further that at least 80% of the child's earnings shall be allotted for his/her education and welfare.


Meanwhile, children's employment or participation in public entertainment or information through cinema, theater, radio or television shall be allowed provided such employment is covered by a Contract duly approved by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE).

In no case, however, shall children be allowed to work at night, from 8:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M.

**Section 8. Sanctions for Obscene, Indecent, and Immoral Acts or Conduct in Public.** To prevent the degradation of moral values of the children of Oriental Mindoro and in adherence to generally accepted sense of values of the Filipino people and in attempt

  
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
  
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

to maintain the standard of decency in the province, any person who shall cause any person to appear in the streets or place open on public view, or aboard any vessel, or other forms of water craft, in offensively lewd dress where his or her private genitalia are exposed and other similar indecent, lewd or immoral acts in public, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) or imprisonment of not more than (6) months.

**Section 9. Other Forms of Exploitation.** The following acts are considered "child exploitation" and therefore prohibited hereunder:

- a. Conducting of any activity, school-based or non-school-based, which directly uses children primarily for fund-raising purposes; shall be considered a form of exploitation and therefore prohibited.
- b. Holding of any shows or pageant which requires children to use or wear skimpy outfits or bikinis.

In this regard, the organizers and/or officers of the said activity shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00), without prejudice to other applicable administrative and criminal liabilities.

**Section 10. Establishment of a Monitoring System for Incidence of All Forms of Child Abuse Cases and Criminal Charges filed Against Children and Appropriating Assistance Thereof.** There shall be established in the Province of Oriental Mindoro a comprehensive monitoring system for the purpose of consolidating child abuse cases and criminal charges filed against children. The PNP Women and Children's Protection Desk, in close coordination with the Local Social Welfare and Development Office (LSWDO) and DSWD Field Office, shall facilitate the filing of necessary charges against child abuses and providing assistance to children charged with criminal cases.

It shall be the duty of the apprehending officer to report to concerned LSWDO every case of children in conflict with the law before committing them to court and the said agencies shall immediately cause the filing for the petition of the recognizance release by seeking the assistance of the Public Attorney's Office (PAO).

**Section 11. Children In Conflict with the Law (CICL).** The rights of all CICLs shall at all times be protected, and the speedy trial and early disposition of their cases shall be ensured by all concerned.

**Section 12. Curfew on Minors.** All minors or children below eighteen (18) years of age shall be prohibited from loitering around or sleeping in public places from ten (10) o'clock in the evening until four (4) o'clock in the morning of the following day unless they are in the company of their parents or guardians.

parents conducted by the same office; Provided that this provision shall not be imposed during the Christmas Season and any festivities or celebrations where the presence of children in public places during such time are allowed or encouraged.

**Section 13. Clearance Certificate to Operate Computerized Video Games.** All component local government units are enjoined to require establishments operating computerized video games to secure a clearance certificate to operate said line of business activity from the LSWDO to ensure that the operation of the same shall be strictly regulated with the end of protecting the welfare of children.

**Section 14. Establishment of "O-Makibata Action Hotline".** There shall be established in the Province of Oriental Mindoro, through the PSWDO, a round-the-clock reporting and monitoring base against child abuse and shall act as the 24-hour vanguard of children in all crimes and abuses committed against them. To this end, the PGOrM shall create a team to be known as "O MAKIBATA ACTION TEAM", which means "ORIENTAL MNDORO AY KIKILOS PARA SA BATA", which shall serve as an inter-agency quick action team for detecting, monitoring and rescuing victims of any form of child abuse.

The members of the O-MAKIBATA ACTION TEAM shall be selected from the members of the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children as well as the members of the City/Municipal Council for the Protection of Children.

**Section 15. Strict Implementation of Republic Act No. 7624 otherwise known as "An Act Integrating Drug Prevention and Control in the Intermediate and Secondary Curricula as well as in the Non-Formal, Informal and Indegenous Learning System".** The PGOrM shall strictly implement R.A. No. 7624 in line with the national efforts to protect the children from the veil consequences of substance abuse.

All educational institutions, as contemplated by the title of this section, situated within the province are hereby enjoined to integrate drug prevention and control subjects in their respective curricula. Failure or refusal to comply with this section shall cause the imposition of a fine of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00) and shall be recommended for appropriate sanctions by the Department of Education




**Section 16. Ban on the Sale of Cigars and Cigarettes to All Minors.** The PGOrM shall strictly implement and enforce the provisions of R.A. No. 9211, entitled "An Act Regulating the Packaging, Use, Sale, Distribution and Advertisements of Tobacco Products such as Cigars and Cigarettes and Promote the Right to Health and Instill Health Consciousness among Them" as well as Provincial Ordinance No. 005-2002.

**Section 17. Restriction on the Access of Minors to Intoxicating Products or Alcoholic Beverages.** The PGOrM shall strictly implement and enforce the provisions of Provincial Ordinance No. 007-2002 to safeguard the young Mindoreños from such intoxicating products.

Minors shall be adequately informed of the health risks associated with taking intoxicating products through the stringent regulation and a subsequent prohibition to persons under 18 years of age such as:

- a. Banning the youth on the intake of intoxicating products;
- b. Promotion in elementary and secondary schools and colleges, and other educational institutions through integrating into health and science subjects all health risks associated with drinking liquors; and
- c. Ban on sports, cultural and arts competition sponsorship by such related companies manufacturing, distributing or selling intoxicating products to remove any misleading effect it may have on minors.

**section 18. Maintenance and Upgrading of the Bahay Kanlungan - A Crisis Center for Women and Children.** The Provincial Government, in its effort to establish a

community-based strategy for the protection of children and women, shall maintain and upgrade the Bahay Kanlungan - a crisis center for children and women. The Bahay Kanlungan will serve as a rehabilitation facility that will provide protective services to women, children and youth who are abandoned, victims of domestic violence, rape, incest and other similar cases, and shall be equipped with facilities necessary for conductive dwelling and will provide comprehensive psycho-social interventions and other services both for the children and their families.

The PGOOrM shall ensure that the Bahay Kanlungan is manned with regular employees with plantilla position, subject to CSC rules and regulations.

The PGOOrM shall also encourage all LGUs in the province to establish and maintain similar facility in their respective areas of jurisdiction.

**ARTICLE IV  
PARTICIPATION RIGHTS OF CHILDREN**

**Section 19. Children's Participation in Policy and Decision Making Process.** The Provincial Government is committed to be a venue or an instrument for realizing the children's rights in Oriental Mindoro. It shall recognize the right of every child to express his opinion freely insofar as such opinion is not contrary to law, morals, good customs, public safety and public policy, and to have that opinion to be taken into account in all matters affecting the child, including the child's right to associate and be a member or involved in group, club and other organization for children, to participate in community development activities province-wide, and exercise the right to organize themselves and to obtain information and make those information known regardless of sex, religious beliefs, and tribal identity.

**Section 20. Institutionalization of Provincial Children Consultative Assembly.** To ensure the full participation of the children and the youth in social, cultural, and development programs, projects or activities of the province, the "Provincial Children Consultative Assembly" is hereby institutionalized. It shall be a forum for the expressions of children's views and a venue for communication, discussions and consultations relative to children's issues and concerns and shall serve as an advisory arm of the PCPC. Consistent herewith, it is a must that children from seven (7) to below eighteen (18) years old are convened once a year (annually), so that their needs are heard collectively and addressed correspondingly.

The PSWDO in coordination with the PCPC, is tasked to define the nature, composition, and functions of the said consultative assembly. It shall also formulate a province-wide plan for the organization of children.


**ARTICLE V  
INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS**

**Section 21. Creation of the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children.** The Provincial Government of Oriental Mindoro shall create and maintain the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children (PCPC) serve as the advisory body for the operation of all existing programs and projects designed for the children of Oriental Mindoro.


**Section 22. Composition of the PCPC.** The PCPC shall be composed of the following:


- Chairperson - Provincial Governor
- Vice-Chairperson - Provincial Vice Governor
- Members - Chairperson, SP Committee on Social Services, Women, Children, Family Relations and Elderly


  
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
  
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

**Section 23. Functions of the PCPC.** The PCPC shall have the following functions.

- Coordinate the implementation and enforcement of all laws relative to the promotion of child and youth welfare;
- Formulate an integrated provincial policy and long-range programs, monitor and evaluate the implementation of this policy and all programs and services relative to the development of the general welfare and protection of the best interests of children and youth;
- Advocate and recommend to the Provincial Governor and other appropriate agencies for implementation on a province-wide scale, when appropriate, new, innovative, pilot programs and services for the general welfare of children; and
- Submit annually to the Provincial Governor and to the Regional Sub-Committee for the Welfare of Children a comprehensive report on its activities and accomplishments.

**Section 24. Creation of the Municipality/City Council for the Protection of Children.** The Provincial Government shall encourage all LGUs in the province to create their respective Municipal/City Council for the Protection of Children.

The municipal mayors and city mayor of the respective municipalities and city are hereby enjoined to spearhead the creation and strengthening of the said Council with the support of the PCPC and other concerned government and non-government agencies as well as initiate the creation of similar council in all barangays of their respective municipalities.

**ARTICLE VI  
FINAL PROVISIONS**

**Section 25. implementing rules and regulations.** Within the period of six (6) months after the approval of this Ordinance, the Provincial Governor, with the assistance of the Provincial Legal Officer, PSWDO and the PCPC, shall formulate and issue the appropriate rules and regulations necessary for the efficient and effective implementation of any and all provisions of this Ordinance.

**Section 26. Penalty for Refusal or Neglect on the Part of Any Private/Public Official or Employee to Implement this Ordinance.** Any person, whether public or private official or employee, found to have violated any provision of this ordinance shall be punished with six (6) months imprisonment and a fine of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) or both depending upon the discretion of the court. In case the offender is a public officer or employee, he shall, in addition to his criminal liability, be administratively liable, provided that due process on administrative discipline as established under Civil Service Law and other pertinent laws shall be strictly observed before said penalty is imposed to concerned offender.

In case of offenses covered by related national laws, as embodied in this ordinance, the same shall be prosecuted and penalized thereunder.

**Section 27. Funding.** To ensure the effective and efficient implementation of this Ordinance, the Provincial Government shall allocate initial fund amounting to One Million Pesos (P1,000,000.00) and shall regularly appropriate funds.

**Section 28. Separability Clause.** If for any reason a provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, all other provisions herein not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**Section 29. Repealing Clause.** All ordinances, executive orders, resolutions and other local memoranda or rules inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**Section 30. Effectivity Clause.** This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days following the completion of its full publication in local newspapers of general circulation with the Province of Oriental Mindoro."

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
